Tips For Shooting A Good Video

- 1. You don't have to have a video camera to shoot good video. Most digital cameras are capable of recording video.
- 2. Try to keep the camera steady. You may want to use a tripod. Watching a shaky video can be distracting.
- 2. To avoid mislabeling, try to show your school's name by filming a shot of the school sign.
- 3. Check your sound and lighting. Make sure there is adequate lighting to showcase your subject(s). But try to film with the light behind you, shining on what you are shooting. Perform a sound check before you begin shooting your video.



- 4. Make sure your battery is charged and bring a backup. You don't want to miss the action because your battery is dead.
- 5. Get shots of fun things happening, employees being interviewed by the reporters, award ceremonies and any other celebration activities for that day.
