

UTRUST APPRECIATION PROGRAM

Role of the A-Team. The A-Team ("A" for appreciation) is a group of 12-18 students who lead the school in implementing the Utrust Appreciation Program (UAP). The A-Team plans activities and enlists other students, staff and community to help in celebrating eight (8) appreciation days during the school year. They recognize the various groups of school employees who make a difference in students' lives each day.

The A-Team is divided into three groups: the Action Crew, the Creative Crew and the Paparazzi Crew. The responsibilities of each crew is described below. Each of the three crews has its own adult adviser.

How the A-Team Works. The A-Team meets prior to each appreciation day with the school coordinator and the A-Team advisers to consider activities suggested in the packet designed U-Trust for that appreciation day. The ideas will be built

around a theme to stimulate the A-Team's creativity and make the celebrations unique. The A-Team may want to add to, delete or substitute activities for those provided in the Utrust packet. The goal is to honor school employees with activities that are fun and expressions of



appreciation that are sincere.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Action Crew. The Action Crew is responsible to enlist individuals or groups to help make each appreciation day a success by doing the following:

- Select a message to put on the marquee to inform the community about the appreciation day and encourage them to join in the celebration of the employee group being recognized.
- Select students to make announcements (provided by Utrust)
 on the school intercom to inform the students and staff about
 the appreciation day and encourage their involvement. Select
 students who will turn the announcements into a dramatic
 presentation and make them fun and interesting by using
 inflection and humor.
- Arrange for an individual or group of students to sing the special appreciation day **song** to the employee group being honored. Work out specifics such as date, time and location of the presentation.
- Consider what individuals or groups are in the school or community that could make the appreciation day special.
 Then, enlist them to help out. Clubs, athletic teams, student government, churches or Sunday school classes are usually more than willing to help out with a particular appreciation day.
- Contact volunteers who have agreed to help with an appreciation day celebration. Remind them of the theme and who is being honored (and how many). Tell them when and where they or their items are needed. Usually these people have volunteered at the beginning of the year to help with a particular appreciation day.
- Write personalized thank you notes using the theme to each person in the group being honored on each appreciation day.

The Creative Crew. The Creative Crew is usually made up of 4-6 students who design decorative posters, cards, goodie bags and other items needed to create a theme-related atmosphere. Specifically the Creative Crew will usually:

- Design and write personalized **thank you notes** to honorees using the theme of each appreciation day.
- Make posters and signs to show appreciation to the honorees and post them around the school.

- Decorate goodie bags for each honoree on their special day.
- If candy bars or water bottles are included in the tokens of appreciation, design labels or print the ones included in each packet to wrap the bottles or candy bars.
- Design a using the theme backdrop for photos on the appreciation day when needed.
- Participate in the **presentation** for each appreciation day.

The Paparazzi Crew. The Paparazzi Crew uses photos or videos to tell the story of each appreciation day. The following are examples of things the Paparazzi might do for an appreciation day.

- Design and write personalized, theme related **thank you notes** to the honorees on each appreciation day.
- Plan with crew members what **photos and videos** to shoot to tell the story of each appreciation day.
- Use Youtube, Vimeo, Smilebox, Powerpoint or other available method. to package photos and videos into a keepsake for the honoree.
- Participate in the **presentation** to honorees and provide each with a link to access the keepsake.
- Upload pictures and/or video clips along with a short, detailed summary of the appreciation day to the Utrust Coordinators closed Facebook group.

The Paparazzi Crew plays a major part in making each appreciation day special for the honorees. Honorees will cherish the photos and videos made by the Paparazzi for a lifetime.

Follow-Up. After each appreciation day, the A-Team should evaluate how things went. The students and leaders should reflect on the successes and explore ways to make the next appreciation day even better.

It is important for all the A-Team crew members to say "thank you" in person, by e-mail or with a handwritten note to those who helped make the appreciation day successful.
