# INSTRUCTIONS FOR G-FORCE ADVISERS

## Culture BINGO



### HOW IT WORKS

1. G-Force will announce 3-4 Bingo numbers and associated kindness tasks each day for 3 weeks. When Students and Staff hear a number that is on their card, they mark the number with a slash.
2. Then, they complete the task in order to mark the second slash to make an X and complete the square.
3. They can check the Kindness Key on the board for the kindness task associated with that number if they missed it during announcements. (Note: Staff have the same numbers but a different set of tasks).
4. Bingo is 5 in a row, across, down or diagonally. They use the same card all month and may get multiple Bingos on one card. Multiple Bingos means a bigger prize!
5. They must put their name on the back of the card and turn it in to enter the prize drawing.


